<sup>1</sup> The criminal docket will be shared between the 33<sup>rd</sup> and 424<sup>th</sup>. The single-district filing scheme is done for convenience of the clerks' docketing and for easier scheduling by the court coordination staff.

<sup>2</sup> Judge Jones will hear all juvenile matters with the exception of detention hearings which may be heard by Judge Mills as needed.

<sup>3</sup> Notwithstanding the court of filing, the courts have concurrent jurisdiction and automatic bench exchange.

<sup>4</sup> CPS cases will continue to be heard by the Associate Judge for the Cluster Court. The 33<sup>rd</sup> Judicial District is the one which by Supreme Court order is part of that Cluster Court, thus the filings need to remain in the 33<sup>rd</sup>. However, either court can hear CPS cases that are returned to the referring court.
